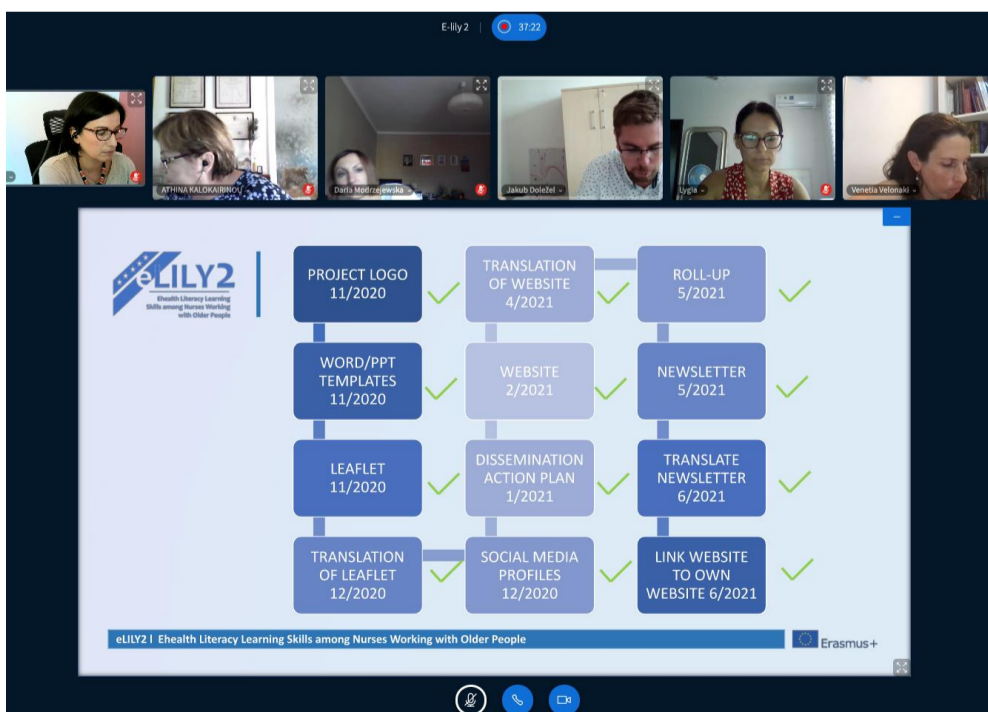

SECOND TRANSNATIONAL MEETING

The second transnational meeting took place on 26.-27. 8. 2021. The meeting, which was originally planned face to face in Athens, took place online, due to the still unfavourable epidemic situation caused by COVID-19. The meeting, organized by the National and Kapodistrian University of Athens in Greece with co-Host the Cyprus University of Technology, was attended by all participating project partners - Klaipeda State University of Applied Sciences (Lithuania), University of Humanities and Economics in Lodz (Poland) and University of Ostrava (Czech Republic).



The first day was devoted to the evaluation of the current state of the project, the preparation of an interim report on financial management. The partners were acquainted with the current plans within the dissemination and evaluation of the project. The second day of the meeting was devoted to the implementation of the project and the four intellectual outputs (the curriculum and contents, eLearning version of the course, piloting methodology and recommendation guide).

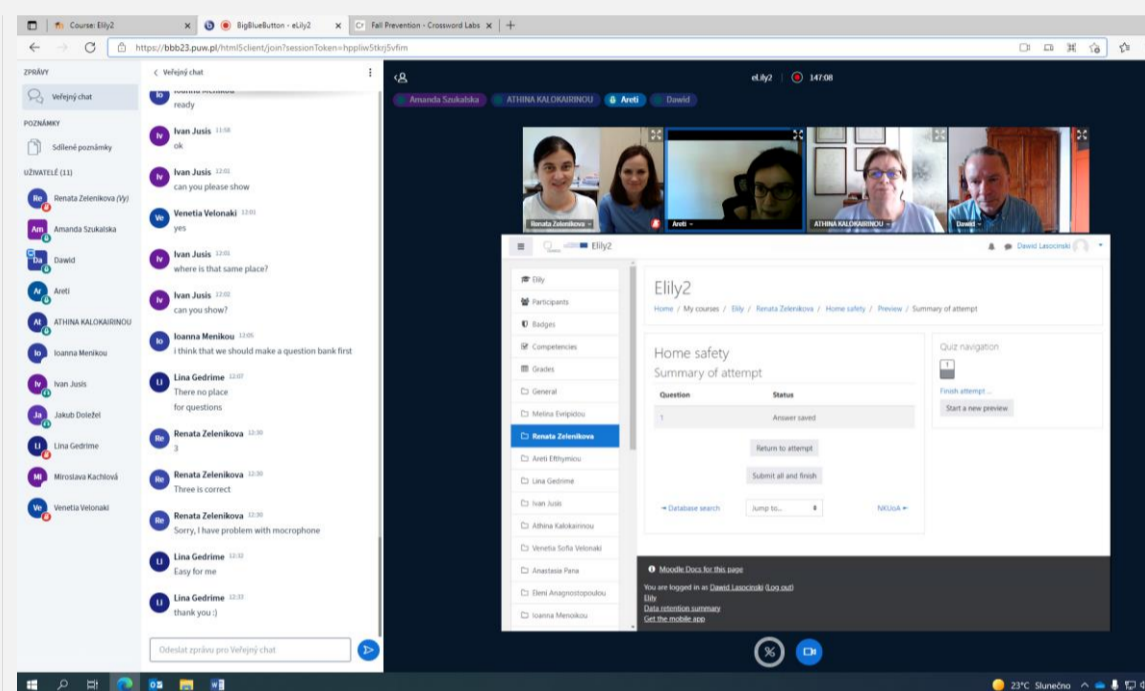
CONTINUE TO THE NEXT PAGE

The consortium has already completed the development of the course and plans the eLearning version. Four modules promoting eHealth Literacy and Health Literacy are now available for piloting in next phase: 1) General background of Health Literacy and eHealth Literacy, 2) Skills in Practice (Identification of patients with limited Health Literacy) 3) Feasibility and readability issues and eHealth challenges 4) Health Literacy and Patient Safety.

During the meeting, the second phase of intellectual outputs were planned, focusing on the issue of the e-learning version of the course. The 3-day Training event was also discussed, organised by Akademia of Economic and Humanistic Studies in Lodz, Poland. The training aims to support the partners' research teams in the development of the contents appropriate for the eLearning version and will take place on 14 to 16th September 2021.

ONLINE STAFF TRAINING

The online staff training of the project was organized by the University of Humanities and Economics in Lodz (Poland) on 14th - 16th September 2021. The meeting was held online with the participation of all participating project partners – Cyprus University of Technology (Cyprus), Klaipėda State University of Applied Sciences (Lithuania), National and Kapodistrian University of Athens (Greece) and University of Ostrava (Czech Republic).

Researchers' Night at University of Ostrava

During Researchers' Night at University of Ostrava in the Czech Republic on Friday 24th September 2021 the project and its activity was presented to the Czech public. The aim of this dissemination activity was to alert the public to the problem of health literacy of elderly and to explain the impact of health literacy and e-health literacy on patient safety for older people living in the community. The roll-up with the project information was placed in the room where public continuously were present during 5 hours. In addition, people of all ages could for a while to feel as elderly thanks to the old age-simulator and to try how many barriers and threats are present at home environment. Then, the available technologies and applications for seniors were presented to public. Leaflet with several examples of technologies and useful applications were distributed.

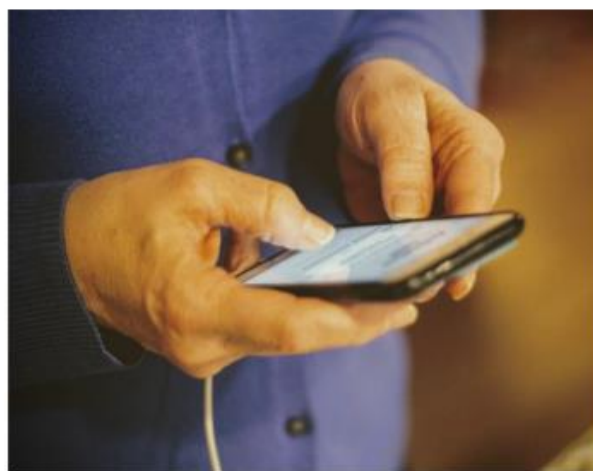

eHealth Literacy is a priority for the European Union

Health literacy is defined as the cognitive and social skills that determine the motivation and ability of individuals to access, understand and use information. It is therefore extremely important to promote people's access to health information and their ability to use it effectively.

Nurses working in community settings, are the primary health care professionals who come in contact with large groups of people, making assessments and recognizing early signs of poor health and other problems, and acting as gatekeepers for the Health care services. In many cases, nurses have to deal with patients and families with inadequate levels of health literacy and ehealth literacy.

People with low health literacy make higher use of healthcare services, do not follow treatment plans, stay longer in hospital, do not follow preventive strategies and have lower self-efficacy. The eLily2 project aims to train nursing students and nurses caring for the older people how to increase the health literacy of seniors and their families.

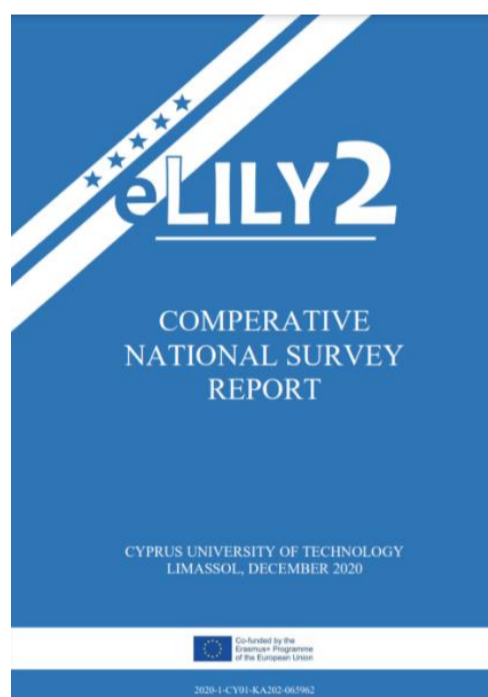
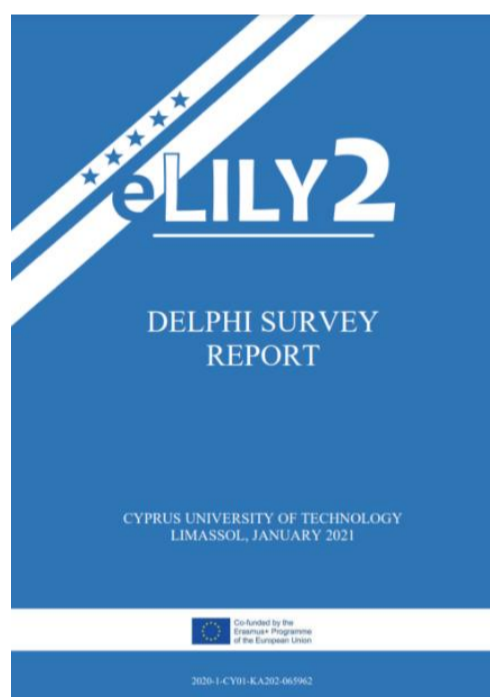
